

ORDINANCE NO. 96-02

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THAT AN IMMINENT PERIL TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE REQUIRES THE ADOPTION OF AN INTERIM MORATORIUM; DECLARING AN INTERIM MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR NEW DEVELOPMENT REQUIRING SEWER CONNECTIONS TO THE MACKS INN-ISLAND PARK SEWER SYSTEM; DECLARING THE LENGTH OF SUCH MORATORIUM; AND, DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FREMONT COUNTY, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Board of County Commissioners of Fremont County, Idaho, hereby declare that an imminent peril to the public health, safety or welfare requires the adoption of an interim moratorium, as more fully set out below, due to the existence of the following facts:

A. The Macks Inn-Island Park Sewer system is presently at or near its maximum capacity.


B. The addition of any new sewer hook ups to the Macks Inn-Island Park sewer system will put that system over its maximum operating capacity, and place the system in violation of its permit capacity.

2. The Board of County Commissioners of Fremont County, Idaho hereby declare an interim moratorium on the issuance of permits for any and all new development requiring sewer connections to the Macks Inn-Island Park sewer system.

3. The interim moratorium declared above shall be for a period of one year, from and after its effective date.

4. This ordinance and moratorium shall be in full force and effect, THIRTY (30) days after its passage and publication, all as provided by law.
