RESOLUTION NO. 2018- 13

The Fremont County Board of Commissioners hereby states and declares that it is in the best interest of the County, its residents, and those who visit Fremont County that the following Land Use Plan – specifically addressing Highway 20 from Pond’s Lodge through the Montana State line – be outlined below:

WHEREAS, this Land Use Plan is prompted by, among other things, recent notification to the Commission of proposed changes to the speed limits within the area described above, and the Targhee Pass Project which was conceptualized many years ago;

WHEREAS, this Land Use Plan safeguards public safety, preservation of wildlife, protection of property values, useful and beneficial use of land, continued and sustained recreational activities, public access, prevention of the spread of invasive species, and more;

WHEREAS, this Land Use Plan will assist the County in their efforts to encourage continued growth, provide safety for residents and visitors of Fremont County, reduce the impact on wildlife – including death, and encourage tourism; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interested of the Commissioners to provide notice to all of the Land Use Plan detailed below.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FREMONT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS:

- that based on the reasons stated above, and more, the speed limit on Hwy 20, should be 45 miles per hour at the following locations: Pond’s Lodge to Elk Creek; Mack’s Inn to Island Park Village; and Valley View to the Montana State line with a limit of 65 miles per hour at the remaining areas between Pond’s Lodge and the Montana State line;
- that based on the reasons state above, and more, the installation of animal detection system(s), digital message sign(s), seasonal wildlife warning sign(s), posting of advisory speed(s), and vegetation removal and pruning should accompany the changes of speed limits as detailed above;
- Fremont County strongly urges other agencies, Cities, organizations, associations, and more to join with Fremont County in this plan, including notification to all agencies considering, or in the process of considering, any plan or action that may have any effect on the area contemplated in this Land Use Plan;
- Fremont County demands that all agencies involved in, no matter how small, any change that may have any tendency to effect the Land Use Plan declared herein to: 1) pause all actions to evaluate whether Fremont County has been adequately communicated and consulted with from the inception of any idea or project; 2) apprise the Commissioners, by appearance at scheduled public meetings, of all projects being


contemplated or considered including providing any and all data, evaluations, assessments, or other used as part of said project; 3) clearly outline to the Commissioners any actions that differ from the Land Use Plan, and engage in meaningful discussions regarding bringing such projects into compliance with said Land Use Plan; and 4) bring to the attention of the Commissioners any legal excuses, exceptions, or other, based upon law that may impact said discussions and Coordination concerning this Land Use Plan; and

- To commit to coordination and local collaboration regarding future projects involving or effecting Fremont County in any way at the idea or project's inception.

This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.


